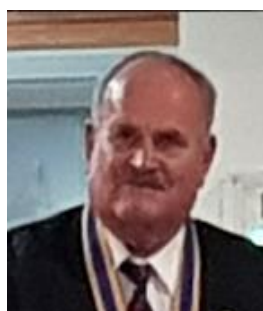

His answer was that he came away with lots of ideas of what Physics actually is!
