Vale Rotarian Kevin Marnell

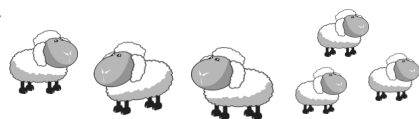
With great sadness we advise that Rotarian Kevin lost his battle with cancer on 24th May 2019.

Guest Speaker

Our speaker this week was Bill Carney who moved down from Sydney in 2000. He has always been interested in history, and in the Examiner at the time were articles from past days in Launceston.

This peaked his interest and after much reading and studying etc. he is now well versed in the history of Launceston. Following are just a few points of interest that he had time to share with us.

Launceston is the third oldest city in Australia being settled in 1806.

The City Park was originally the Governor's vegetable garden and was first named the Peoples Park. There is still a Napoleon pear tree and also two stone pines remaining from that era. The gates to the park date back to 1903.

A relic from the days of gas lamps can still be seen outside the Colonial Motor Inn.

The Batman Faulkner Inn was built around 1822 and used to be the Cornwall Hotel. It was built and named after John Batman and John Faulkner and was later the first night club in Launceston.

Launceston has a few notable firsts such as having the first pedestrian shopping mall in Australia as well as having the first single purpose cinema in the country which was the Majestic Theatre - now the Neill Pitts Men's Wear shop.
